Step 3: Analyze 3 situations of communication / Analyser 3 situations de communication

1. Using the different types of communication that you have seen in the previous step, you need to **present 3 situations experienced during your ELISSE internship experience (or in contact with students from another country) that illustrate one or more many different types of communication**, different from the communication mode that usually characterizes you.

To make this presentation:

- begin by **presenting in a few words the situation**: who is it (you, another person, a group, etc.)? where does it take place ? when or on what occasion? how? with whom ? Here, you can record the situation (audio or video), but if you use this option, you must ask the consent of the people present in advance.- then you can answer the following questions:
 - How would you name this type of communication?
 - How is this type of communication different from the type of communication that usually characterizes you?
 - How does this type of communication seem to fit the cultural context in which it is used?
 - For your point of view, what are the cultural codes necessary to understand the message of your interlocutors (codes without which it is difficult to understand the message)?
 - How do these codes influence the conversation, what are the effects on you and on the others?
 - Can you observe a form of intercultural empathy and flexibility in the described situation?

2. Then, **you share the result of this reflection with at least one person concerned by your ELISSE internship experience**: local supervisor, supervisor of your school of origin, other ELISSE student, member of the teamwork in your place of internship, etc. The goal of this sharing is to get their

feedback on each of the situations. In case of doubt or difficulty, you can talk about it at the next supervision seminar.

You present the final result of your work (presentation of the 3 situations + main elements taken from the answers to the questions + feedback of a third person) in a written document that you post in the [associated box of work](#). This written document includes the feedback from the person to whom you presented the situations, and any adjustments you made after your discussion with this person.
